Ending The Year With A Sparkle At Wellington Airport

More than 30 businesses, community groups, and organisations are welcoming a better and brighter 2021 in a sparkly Christmas display at Wellington Airport.

The annual Christmas Tree Festival – a joint event between Wellington Airport and CFNZ – aims to support businesses and organisations whilst raising funds for support, advocacy, and research for people with cystic fibrosis.

This year CFNZ's two trees focused on advocacy and compassion, with a Trikafta tree featuring photos and stories from some of the Kiwis with CF who would benefit from the breakthrough medication. Next to the Trikafta Tree is a banner with a QR code linked to the Trikafta Petition. The second tree is covered in large-scale versions of the Compassion Pins we created earlier in the year. Advocacy Update

New Children's Hospital in Wellington

CCDHB called for consumer representatives to be a part of clinical design workshops for the New Children's Hospital in Wellington. We submitted three people to be part of this but unfortunately no one was selected for the group.

PHARMAC stakeholder consultation

Jane Bollard, CE participated in a consultation process by PHARMAC to see how they can improve their relationship with their stakeholders. They sought insights into the type of relationship we have with them today and the type of relationship we need into the future. CFNZ was one of 20 initially consulted. A survey has now been developed and has been sent to all stakeholders.

Trikafta Campaign

In this turbulent year of lockdowns it's great to know that Christmas festivities are still going ahead.

On Tuesday night the CFNZ Christmas Tree Festival, held in partnership with Wellington Airport, was opened by the Right Honourable Andrew Little, Minister

of Health.

Ed Lee, a Wellington based person with CF, gave an inspirational talk about how his life has changed with the new Vertex medication, Trikafta. Notable was that he didn't feel like he had CF anymore and that he could now plan his life rather than contemplating a lung transplant. Also his clinical results were greatly improved- his recent lung scans were so remarkable that the radiographer had to check it was the same person!

Jane Bollard, CE CFNZ who attended the opening commented 'If we didn't already know it, hearing Ed gives us a most compelling reason to unite in the campaign to have Trikafta publicly funded in NZ.'



PHARMAC decision improves access to Pulmozyme

On 23 November, PHARMAC informed us of its decision to transition funded access of dornase alfa (Pulmozyme) to a standard Special Authority from 1 December 2020. We welcome this decision, which improves equity of access of Pulmozyme for people with CF and reduces the burden of access.
